I understand that the media has a role in keeping the public safe and informed and I would like to acknowledge the importance of this. I would like to suggest however, that this article is not required public knowledge, and is actually causing more harm than good.

This article works as a breach of my confidentiality, which was acknowledged as a significant aspect in the court outcomes, given my clear record, community involvement, excellent character references and contributions via my work in supporting others. Based on this history and the circumstances of the incident, the courts discretion and decisions reflect an effort to minimise the impact on my professional reputation and livelihood, which I am greatly appreciative of.

This article is an undoing of all that was achieved through the courts and is inaccurate in its dramatisation of the incident and who it portrays me to be. It does not reflect my true character and appears to aim to deformate me.

I have taken responsibility for my part in this incident and I feel I have faced the consequences with humility and honesty at all times. This incident was completely out of character, though this is no excuse for the action I took, I present no harm to the community.

All factors considered, the courts ruled that there would be "no conviction recorded" however this article subjects me to public conviction by those who do not have all the facts and do not need to be a part of this. It puts my professional reputation, livelihood and employments at risk and causes unnecessary confusion to the public and harm to me personally.

My commitment, passion and dedication to my life purpose in the Outdoor Education field, supporting youth and adults through nature-based education is evident in my work history and client feedback. My mission work means the world to me and I know that through it I am making a positive difference in the world.

I appeal to your sense of compassion and your commitment to achieving the best possible outcome for everyone involved. I ask you please for the removal of this article and for pno subsequent publications to be made regarding this matter please.
